Prior to beginning any Agile Business Intelligence project, and to minimise later rework, an initial product backlog, or requirements backlog, needs to be defined by the customer The product backlog describes the current and best-understood requirements, sometimes known as user stories The highest priority

In more recent years, Agile has been adopted outside a software development into project management, decision making, product management and now change management Agile is not just one methodology, but is comprised of several development approaches (eg Scrum, Extreme Programming) underpinned by a set of 12 fundamental principles

### **Managing Defects in an Agile environment**

User Stories (incomplete 'Definition of Done') or work traveling between multiple teams The nature of a Defect typically demands other information to be provided than we normally expect for a User Story This is the reason that Agile Backlog Management tools often have a different template for User Stories and Defects Information
